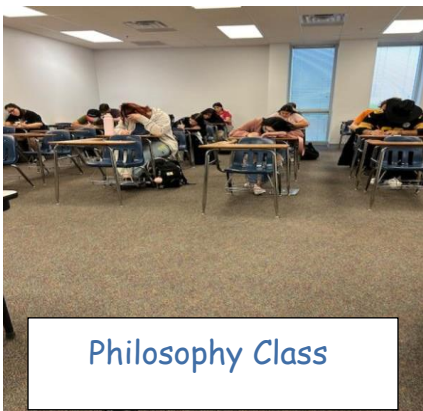

We have just completed a study of "The Life of Christ" with 20 students. They are from various religious backgrounds, but most are not aware that they may have accepted a different Jesus from the One presented in Scripture.
