

Some Quotes from our Recent Seminar

- 1) "Countries around the world are racing to out-pace others in developing the AI synapses, like those in the human brain. So far, China is leading the pack."
- 2) "AI technology was put to the test by asking it to take the college entrance exams given by universities and colleges around the country. Just 18 months ago, the technology could not pass any of the exams. Today, it is able to pass every one of the exams."
- 3) "AI is destabilizing the concept of truth itself in the 2024 election. Images can be generated that show the political candidates saying or doing things that are not true."
- 4) "AI does not just search the internet to find facts and assemble them into a story or essay; it can generate a new story or essay for students. Searching the internet is old-hat that first generation computers could do. This goes far beyond today. This is called *generative* AI."
- 5) "Previously, automation was done to replace the hard, dirty, repetitive tasks. In the future (now), it is targeting the highest paid employees and those with the highest education."
- 6) "In the past, humans wrote the codes for computer use. In 2024, 80% of all coding will be done by AI."
- 7) "The digital-divide will no doubt get wider due to the development of artificial intelligence. It is no longer the issue of providing students with a computer or internet connection. The issue will be how it will be used in education."
- 8) "One big question deals with ethical questions of its use. One cannot program ethics into a computer brain. Intelligence belongs to humans and humans need ethics."
